- In a diverse community you will find that the way animals are cared for can differ based on culture and values.
- ▶ **Educating citizens** on best practices and benefits of TNVR and the active Anti-Cruelty Laws of your local government is crucial.
- ▶ The initial conversation with a caregiver, home or business owner is the most important aspect of conducting TNVR successfully.

Know your Audience

Passionate Pamela

- Will care for the cats at all cost
- Will stop traffic if she sees a kitten on the highway
- Will pay for their medical needs
- Will provide shelter and feed 2 to 3 times a day every day.

Neutral Nick

- Does not mind cats on his property.
- May even feed periodically.
- Indifferent if cat is there or not

Despising Dave

- Seriously does not like cats.
- May have past cat trauma
- May be allergic to cats.
- Cats may be taking over his property and personal belongings
- May be using property in lieu of a liter box







Obstacles to TNVR












- ▶One such initiative MDAS launched is the Community Action Targeted Trapping Initiative (CATTI).
- ▶ Its purpose is to mobilize, recruit, and train teams of TNVR volunteers.
- ▶ Volunteer Tools:
- T-Shirts and I.D. to identify them as assisting ASD.
- Loaner equipment (traps)
- Cat food for bait, as available
- Trap covers (sheets /towels)
- Room at our facility to drop off cats overnight (PAWS Room)
- Priority Animal Welfare Services Room





Thinking outside of the box- Innovative ideas cont'd





MDAS has created a unique stipend program for our "community cat trappers". Residents can earn up to \$15 per cat brought in and returned to its original community by the trapper.

Helpful Trapping Tips

- First lay the groundwork by communicating with the community your intentions and the process.
- Establish a feeding pattern if not adopt the schedule set by the caregiver.
- Withhold food for 24 to 36 hours increase your chances of success.
- Ensure all traps are sanitized and functioning correctly prior to loading your vehicle.
- Count all traps prior to starting and again once your done and insure you have the same amount.
- Using fishy cat food, tuna, maceral, or chicken also increases your chances.
- Position traps where you can see them all then remove yourself from the area.
- Once the easy low hanging fruit (cats) have been caught, only then do you bring out the drop trap for the wiser and more skittish cats.
- Once trapped, immediately cover the trap completely to keep the cat calm and place in transport vehicle with AC running.
- While waiting, log all by marking cages and complete intake paperwork.
- If trapping in several locations at the same time, ensure all cages are labeled accordingly to avoid mix-ups and relocation.
